- Presenter has education and experience related to the content and knowledge of adult learning. Presenter's status as an approved STARS trainer will be considered.

Submit to WAEYC, 841 N Central Ave #206, Kent, WA 98032. Proposals submitted by March 1 will be greatly appreciated. Proposals will be considered until program is complete. A response will be sent to the person listed as the contact presenter in May.

- Expert. A dialogue. Assumes depth of knowledge, full engagement and active incorporation on a consistent or ongoing basis. Think "graduate level" or "coach."
